CBOE SEAT TRADED AT A NEW HIGH OF \$2.65 MILLION

ON TUESDAY, JULY 24

CHICAGO, July 25, 2007 The Chicago Board Options Exchange (CBOE) announced that a CBOE seat, or membership, traded for a new all-time high of \$2,650,000 on Tuesday, July 24, surpassing the previous high of \$2,600,000 for a CBOE seat, which was set on July 12, 2007. Yesterday's transaction marked the second consecutive record sale of a CBOE seat this month.

The first sale of 2007 was at a price of \$1.8 million on January 10. To date, a total of 61 CBOE seats have traded in 2007. During 2006, the highest price paid for a CBOE seat was \$1,775,000 on December 6. The lowest price paid was \$850,000 on January 30, 2006, and the last sale of the year was on December 27 for \$1,750,000. A total of 111 seats changed hands in 2006.

CBOE's Membership Department facilitates the purchase and sale of seats using an auction method in which bids and offers from interested parties are submitted to the Exchange. When a bid matches an offer, a sale is made.

CBOE, the largest options marketplace in the U.S. and the creator of listed options, is regulated by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). For additional information about the CBOE and its products, visit the CBOE website at: www.cboe.com.
